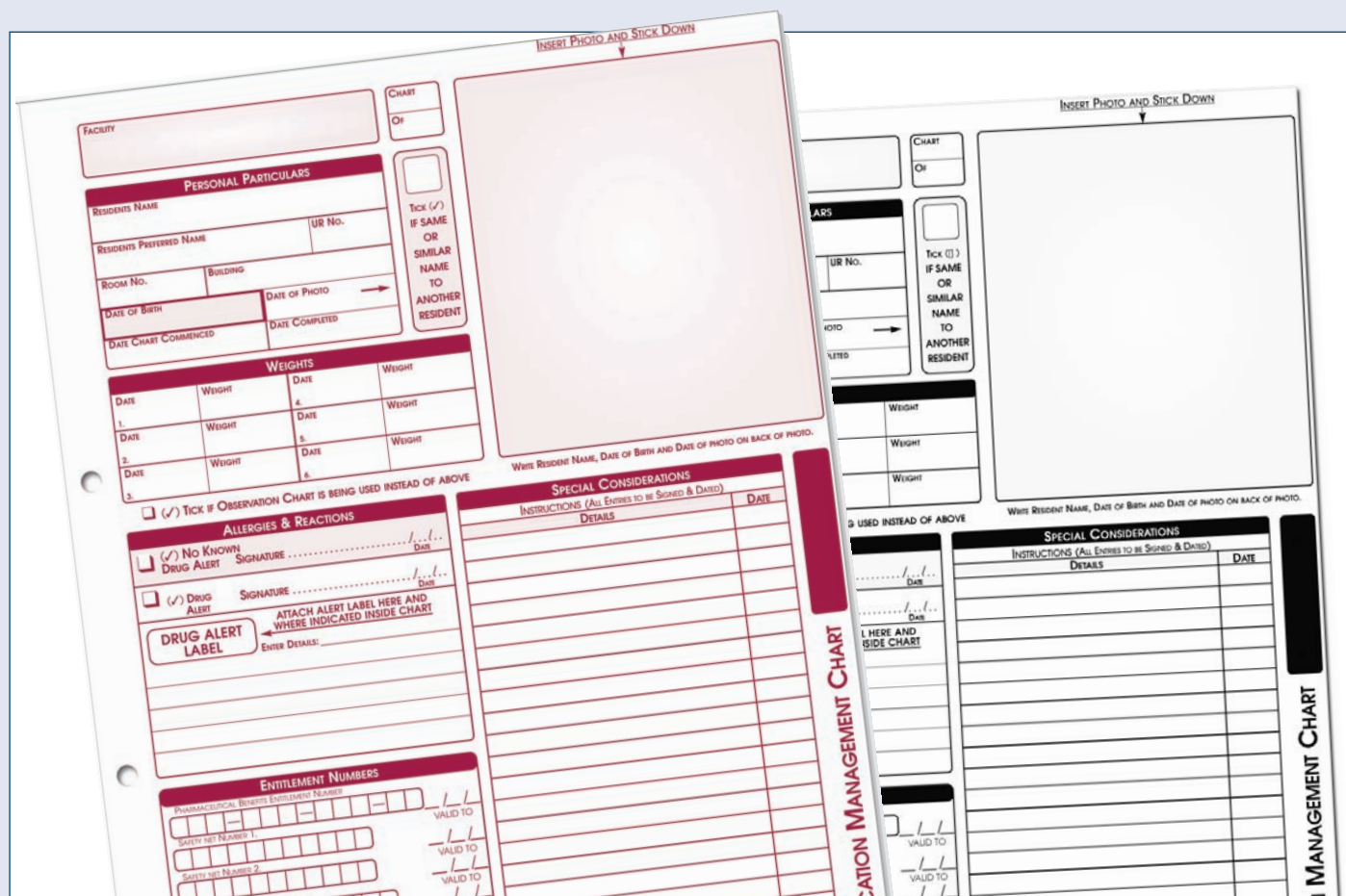


WHAT IS BETTER FOR YOUR RESIDENTS? Medication Chart or Medication List? Medication History or No Medication History?

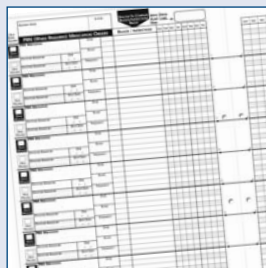

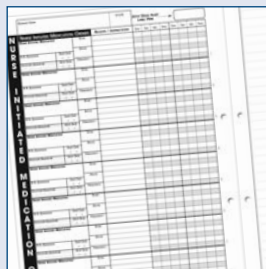

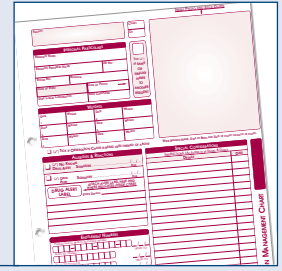

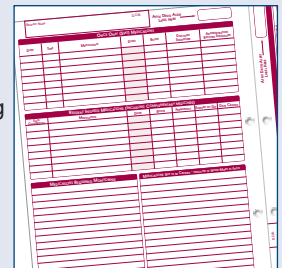

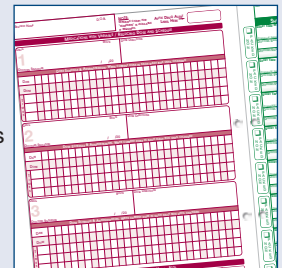

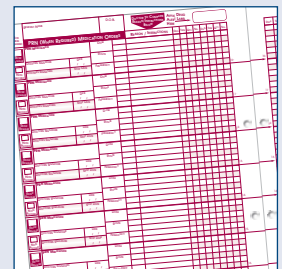
