LTCM01- BLACK 6 MONTH RECORDING CHART MOST POPULAR IN RESIDENTIAL FACILITIES

- 18 Regular med orders
- 9 PRN med orders
- 9 Short Term med orders
- 9 Nurse initiated med orders
- 3 Variable dose med orders
- 2 Intermittent med orders (e.g. B12, Prolia injections)
- 19 Telephone orders
- CRL6 label if only carers were administering or a CRL1 label if RN & carers were administering meds or no label if only RN was administering.
- Has 3 monthly GP reviews
- Can use Short Term auxiliary sheet if excess Short Term med orders
- Can use medical director labels using software such as: Medical Director, Genie and Best Practice
- Community would use these charts with a CRL6 label if only carers were administering or a CRL1 label if RN & carers were administering meds or no label if only RN was administering.
- The main feature this chart has over the community charts (for community use) is the ability to do variable dose medications (Warfarin) and intermittent meds (B12 and Prolia etc...) This means if the community organisation used variable dose sections it would be suitable, if not the LTCC01 or LTCC02 would be sufficient.

CNRMC02- 4 MONTH NATIONAL INPATIENT MEDICATION CHART

- 17 Regular med orders
- 3 Variable med orders (Warfarin)
- 9 Short Term med orders
- 4 Nutritional supplement orders
- 9 PRN med orders, 9 Nurse initiated med orders
- 7 Insulin orders and Diabetes action plan with BGL recording
- This is the chart with prescriptions in it for residential facilities.
- Has colour coded specialised sections for each category of medication- Warfarin, nutritional supplement, Short Term, Regular medication, PRN, Nurse initiated and Insulin.
- Cannot attach medical director labels on this chart however some pharmacy softwares can print medication labels for this chart.

LTHC02- MAROON 6 MONTH RECORDING CHART- THIS CHART IS FOR SIGNING OF ALL PACKED MEDICATIONS

- 18 Regular med orders
- 9 PRN med orders
- 9 Short Term med orders
- 9 Nurse initiated med orders
- 3 Variable dose med orders
- 2 Intermittent med orders (e.g. B12, Prolia injections)
- 19 Telephone orders
- This chart doesn't allow for RN's to sign for individual packed medications.
- Carers sign in this chart to administer all packed medications and sign on treatment sheets for non-packed medications.
- If there are more than 18 Regular packed medications they can add another Regular medications auxiliary sheet.

CRC02- 9 WEEK RESPITE CHART

- Specially designed chart for 9 weeks of medication recording (national funding for respite is 9 weeks)
- 17 Regular med orders
- 4 Short Term med orders
- 5 PRN med orders
- 2 Nurse initiated med orders
- 3 Telephone orders
- Carers can sign for all packed medications and RN can sign individually
- Can use medical director labels to Regular medication section using software such as: Medical Director, Genie and Best Practice

LTCC01- BLUE 6 MONTH COMMUNITY CHART (NO PHOTO POCKET)

- 17 Regular med orders
- 4 PRN med orders
- 5 Short Term med orders
- 3 Nurse initiated med orders
- 3 Telephone orders
- Carers can sign for all packed medications and RN can sign individually
- Can use Short Term auxiliary sheet if excess Short Term medications
- Does NOT have variable dose (Warfarin) section
- Can use medical director labels using software such as: Medical Director, Genie and Best Practice
- Does not have GP reviews

LTCC02- BLUE 6 MONTH COMMUNITY CHART (WITH PHOTO POCKET)

- 17 Regular med orders
- 9 PRN med orders
- 9 Short Term med orders all colour coded
- Carers can sign for all packed medications and RN can sign individually
- Can use Short Term auxiliary sheet if excess Short Term medications
- Does NOT have variable dose (Warfarin) section
- Does NOT have Nurse initiated section
- Can use medical director labels using software such as: Medical Director, Genie and Best Practice
- Has medicine reviews, notes and prescriber verbal instructions
